4. GVTC Update- Redshelf- Robert Keown and Pam Warren

- Redshelf is a bookstore. Pair with publisher. Recently paired with Pearson. Offer one option. Inclusive access. Direct bill will be phased out and replaced by Inclusive Access.
- Colleges must keep track of students. Banner scripts will need to be written.
- Colleges billed at a later date.
- Security concern as they have asked for an administrative access to Blackboard which will allow access to all students. What will they do with the student information?
- Students would have to "opt out" rather than drop in. If they drop out, the student will be withdrawn from that class.
- Concern that colleges will need to run drop/add and withdrawal lists and send to Redshelf within their timeline. Otherwise, the college will be billed.
