1. Program Updates

Aviation- Steve Conway: Current program and FAA rules – the aviation program will fall
under the general guidelines provided by Josh McKoon last week. This means that the
program directors should submit paperwork for starting June 1 or any earlier. Follow
general guidelines: social distancing and cleaning.

Cannot have more than 10 students in a classroom.

Limited Labs can begin anytime. FAA has not provided any different guidelines.

- Applied Technical Math- Dr. Nathalie Dames

- Should have course loaded into KMS by the end of the week.
- Will have a session with faculty from colleges that do plan to adopt the course.

- Law Enforcement- Jason Strickland

- Mike Ayers, Executive Director, POST has convened a group which includes all academy directors, police chiefs, sheriff's officials, and TCSG reps. Steven Ferguson and Jason.
- Purpose: to explore ways academies can continue to operate online if we end-up in another emergency situation
- Currently developing 10 content modules and exploring testing options. The goal is to have a standard post approved online curriculum.
- Future goals taking the approved online content and developing a hybrid model to enhance current academy training.
- Full working group meeting next week.

Question: How do you handle when a student self-discloses that they were exposed to COVID-19 or may have it? (Do you ask for medical clearance to return to limited labs?)

- Kathryn checked with safely experts to remind us to encourage students to seek medical assistance.
- College has POC who contacts student.
- Medical certification waiver. Make sure student signs waiver.

3. Question: How are you handling incompletes, particularly in regard to adjunct pay?

Amy Holloway: How do you pay adjuncts with the expectation that they may have to return the following semester to complete grading?

- Full-time faculty are covering in most cases.
- May have to pay an hourly rate to adjuncts if needed.
- 4. Question: How are you handling incompletes, for Dental Assisting clinical requirements since it may be fall before the student can finish the requirement?

Steve Pearce: Dental offices will not need students until fall. I grades have been extended through summer.

- Other colleges have extended I grade completion deadline through fall term.
- 5. Limited Labs Do you still need to submit every single CRN into the portal even though the need to wait on approval is no longer there?
