

Adaptive Release

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What is Adaptive Release?

When you customize the release of content. You can use adaptive release to show the appropriate content, to select individuals, at the appropriate time.



Rules and Criteria

- Rules are used to release content.
- Criteria are the parts that define rules.
 - You can apply one or more criterion to each rule.



Basic and Advanced Adaptive Release

Basic

 Apply one rule to a content item. This rule can contain all four types of criteria, but not multiple instances of the same type.

Advanced

 Apply more than one criteria to a rule, or you can specify different options for releasing the content.



Four Types of Criteria

Criteria	
Date	The instructor can set the content to be released to students at a specific time.
Membership	Makes the item available to specific students or course groups.
Grade	Makes content available based on certain conditions in the gradebook.
Review Status	Makes content available once a specified item has been marked as reviewed.

NOTE: You can only add one membership criterion and one date criterion for each rule. You can add multiple Grade Center and review status criteria to each rule.

Reminders (1)

- Basic: All criteria in all rule must be completed before the item is released.
- Advanced: Students must meet all of the criteria of one of the rules to gain access.
- Basic & Advanced: The more criteria added to a rule, the harder it is for students to gain access.



Reminders (2)

- After adaptive release rules are set for an item, only students who meet the criteria of the rules will be able to see the item.
- Always use the student preview tool to see what content students can and can't access.
